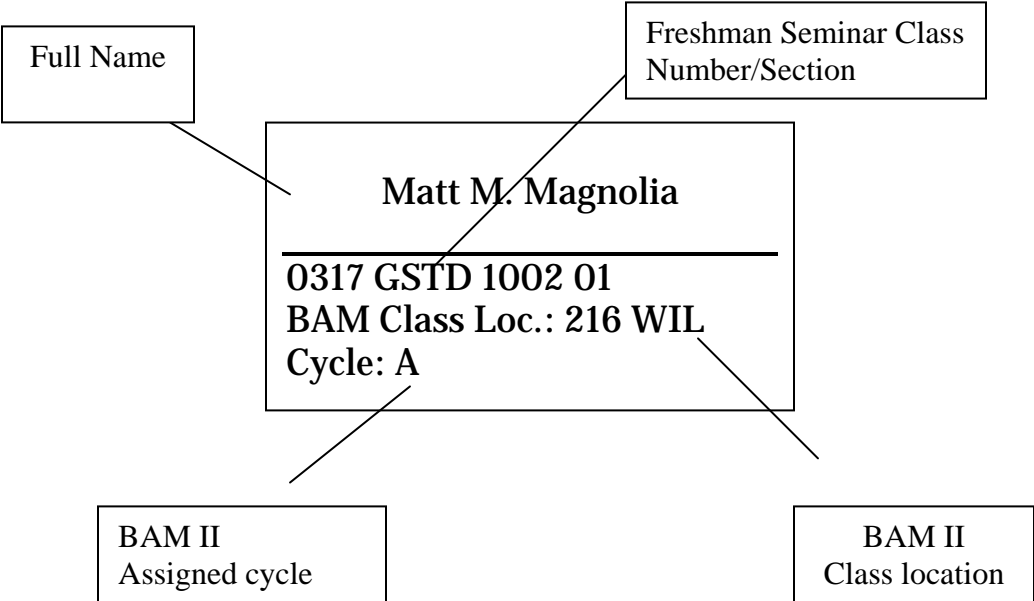

Office of Student Life—Located in the Reynolds Center in office 101. This office houses the dean of students and director of the Reynolds Center. Many services are available in the office.

Office of Student Activities—Located in the Reynolds Center in office 201. This office houses the assistant dean for student activities, assistant dean for multicultural affairs, Greek Life office, SGA & SAB office, and varying organization's cubicles. Many services are available in the office.

Post Office—Located in the Reynolds Center in office 106. The post office is open during the school year Monday—Thursday 10:00 a.m. – 3:30 p.m.; Friday 10:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.; Saturday 10:00 a.m. – 11:00 p.m.

Follett SAU Bookstore—Located in the Reynolds Center in room 107. The bookstore is a one stop college shopping center. It is the place to get textbooks, notebooks, pens, and pencils. There is also a variety of SAU merchandise: greeting cards, cups, caps, sweatshirts, T-shirts, shorts, and many other items.

SAU Dining Services

The Blue & Gold Cafeteria is located in room 109 of the Donald W. Reynolds Campus and Community Center. All students, whether in the residence hall or commuting, may eat in the dining hall.
